As we look ahead, let us continue our journey towards a greener, more equitable world, united in our shared vision of creating lasting change for generations to come.



#### Project to pave remote schools with paver blocks made using low value/non-recyclable waste plastic

We started the project just when the nation and region was entering its second wave of Covid-19. This posed its challenges and proved to be a blessing in disguise.

We were able to support the local community including our waste collection partners with an opportunity to collect waste which was relatively easily available. We created jobs for locals in the village (Chamasari) as quite a few young folks had lost their jobs

due to the lockdown.

Chamasari is a village situated in Dehradun district in the lower Himalayas.

Population is 974 with the number of households at 236.

Chamasari has a primary school and high school with more than 150 pupils. The village also has a community center which is used for events like meetings and weddings by the locals and surrounding villages.

We proposed to pave the yards in front of the schools and community center. This gave the children a cleaner and safer place to play. The community yard used to get muddy and partly inaccessible during rains. Paving these areas with our tiles enabled people to use it even when the weather is wet (which is often in the mountains)

One of the highlights of the year was our ambitious tree planting initiative in the Sunderbans, specifically around the Bali Island region. Despite the logistical and environmental challenges posed by the pandemic, we remained resolute in our commitment to reforesting degraded landscapes and conserving biodiversity. Through tireless dedication and collaboration with local communities and authorities, we planted over 25,000 trees in the Sunderbans, contributing to the restoration of vital ecosystems and the mitigation of climate change impacts.











## Revenue for the year : Rs 15 lakhs
